Jobs for Life



A 32-hour Biblically-based class offered twice a year for those looking to build their resume with soft skill training (i.e. resolving workplace conflict, the importance of being on time, making a good first impression). Classes are taught at the Mondo Anaya Community Center.

Hot Lunch Program



Monday—Saturday a hot meal is served to participants at Fountains of Living Water Church from 11am-12pm. Emergency food boxes can be requested and a clothes closet is made available to those in need.

Los Angeles de Esperanza



Socialization opportunities for seniors 55+ five days a week at the Mondo Anaya Community Center. Weekly activities include coffee hour, crafts, Bible study, indoor exercise and occasional presentations by community partners. An onsite computer lab is available for use and periodical trainings for email, online safety, and social media

Wellness Clinic



On the second Saturday each month, the Mondo Anaya Community Center provides initial screening for basic medical care by a Sun Life Family Medical Clinic doctor. Referals are given as needed. No appointments are necessary, patients are seen on a first come first served basis.

Afferschool Program



Provides a structured learning environment for children in elementary school. Volunteers provide educational support with Power Hour (homework help) and help teach pro-social behaviors.

Develops peer leader life skills for teens ages 13-18. Teens receive leadership training, and assist in and supervise daily activities.

Stanfield Medical Clinic



Held at First Baptist Church in Stanfield, the clinic provides medical care by a team of volunteer doctors and nurses on specific Wednesdays September through May. Prescriptions and testing referrals are given as needed. No appointments are necessary, patients are seen on a first come first served basis. Contact our office for a list of clinic

Dear Sir or Madam:

This letter is in response to your telephone call requesting a copy of your organization's determination letter. This letter will take the place of the copy you requested.

Our records indicate that a determination letter issued in September 1997 granting your organization exemption from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. That letter is still in effect.

Based on information subsequently submitted, we classified your organization as one that is not a private foundation within the meaning of section 509(a) of the Code because it is an organization described in sections 509(a)(1) and 170(b)(1)(A)(vi).

This classification was based on the assumption that your organization's operations would continue as stated in the application. If your organization's sources of support, or its character, method of operations, or purposes have changed, please let us know so we can consider the effect of the change on the exempt status and foundation status of your organization.

Your organization is required to file Form 990, Return of Organization Exempt from Income Tax, only if its gross receipts each year are normally more than \$25,000. If a return is required, it must be filed by the 15th day of the fifth month after the end of the organization's annual accounting period. The law imposes a penalty of \$20 a day, up to a maximum of \$10,000, when a return is filed late, unless there is reasonable cause for the delay.

All exempt organizations (unless specifically excluded) are liable for taxes under the Federal Insurance Contributions Act (social security taxes) on remuneration of \$100 or more paid to each employee during a calendar year. Your organization is not liable for the tax imposed under the Federal Unemployment Tax Act (FUTA).

Organizations that are not private foundations are not subject to the excise taxes under Chapter 42 of the Code. However, these organizations are not automatically exempt from other federal excise taxes.

Donors may deduct contributions to your organization as provided in section 170 of the Code. Bequests, legacies, devises, transfers, or gifts to your organization or for its use are deductible for federal estate and gift tax purposes if they meet the applicable provisions of sections 2055, 2106, and 2522 of the Code.
